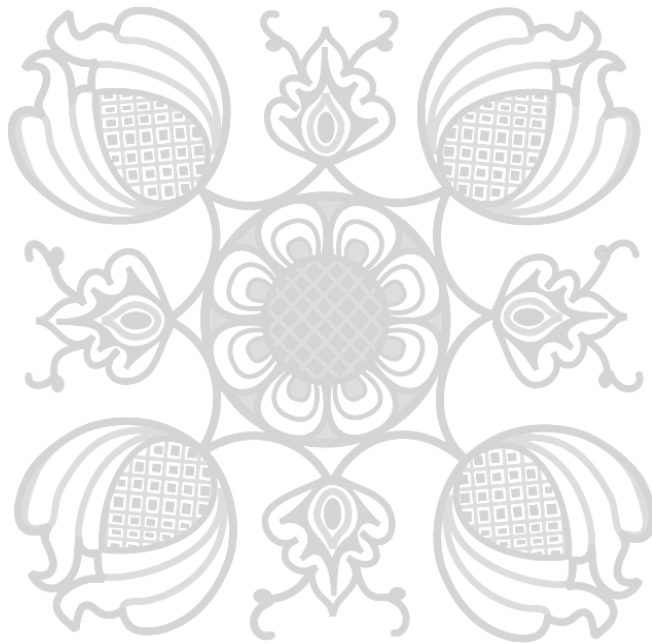

Secretary General's Report for 2012 – The Annual General Meeting

Eight years have passed since the establishment of the National Trust in May 2005 and by now it has grown into a strong and a well recognized non-governmental national body with 325 members of heritage conscious citizens of which majority are of high academic standing and belonging to various professions. Out of the above total 93 are life members. Being enlightened citizens of the country, some have served the nation for more than four decades, while some are still serving. Let me take this opportunity to place on record the sad news of the passing away of two of our active members during the year, the Late Dr. A.R.B.Amerasinghe and the Late Ms. Nirmala de Mel who served the Trust from the inception, advising and guiding us on our day to day activities. I deeply mourn their loss. As it was done before, during the year 2012 also the National Trust arranged opportunities for each member to witness the presence of most their fellow members monthly at the special lecture gatherings. We were successful in continuing the traditions of conducting monthly special lecture sessions and the monthly progress review meetings of the Trustees continuously during the year 2012, without any interruption and also by keeping the general membership informed about the current activities being carried out. Today we have just concluded the 80th Meeting of the Trustees and the having our eight AGM. The expansion of other heritage related activities of the National Trust has been remarkable, during the year under review. The year 2012 also showed much promise for the National Trust as seen by its achievements and through the successful implementation of a number of other heritage related activities which benefited its Members in particular and the public in general. On behalf of the Trustees I wish to place on record here our sincere appreciation of the contribution and support extended to the Trust by the general membership. The main reasons for having another successful year of the National Trust have been the dedication of the Trustees and the Members and the team spirit and the enthusiasm of all.

Let me now highlight some of the major activities conducted during the period under review and their achievements to date:

- **Conducting of regular Monthly Progress Meetings of the Trustees and of the Management Committee:**

The monthly progress review meetings of the Trustees and of the Management Committee which were instrumental in getting the policies and plans of the Trust approved and implemented, took place on a regular basis during the year under review. These meetings are most healthy as they create an opportunity for the relevant experts to work-out strategies in relation to the development needs of cultural and natural heritage of the country and to assist the relevant public and private institutions to get the recommended strategies implemented. These meetings also help to review the progress of regular activities undertaken monthly and to keep the organization active all the time. All twelve monthly meetings for 2012 inclusive of the AGM, as planned scheduled for the year were conducted successfully, with more than the required quorum at each meeting. From the inception to date, 80 meetings of the main body

have been held. As reported at the last AGM, one of the main driving forces behind the success of the affairs of the Trust during this year has been the role played by the **“Management Committee”** which met every month, in advance of the Trustees Meetings and worked out every minute detail of the programmes covering all aspects of Fundraising and financial management, Membership drive and policy frame works in relation to the day to day activities of the Trust. On behalf of the general membership, let me take this opportunity to extend our gratitude, to Dr. Roland Silva, Mr. N.G. Wickremarathna, Mr. U.L.Kadurugamuwa, and Mr. K. Kanag-Isvaran who served as Members of the Management Committee and worked with much dedication throughout the year and to Ms. Devika Anthonys of the National Trust office, the committee coordinator, Ms. Gayathri Ganeshan of the HNB Sustainability Foundation which provides financial support to run the Trust office and to Major General (Rtd) Lohan Gunawardena, all of whom contribute their share to the committee in particular and to the Trust in general to reach the present level of success.

- **Scientific sub-committees of the National Trust:**

The Scientific Sub-committees which are eight in number conducted regular monthly meetings and discussions to formulate and carryout plans covering the respective specialized subjects and so supported the main body. They programmes were of immense importance to the Trust in particular and to the heritage of the nation at large. They cover a wide range of heritage subjects namely; Monuments and Sites, Moveable Artifacts, Natural Heritage, Intangible Heritage, Paintings, Sculpture and Visual Arts, Architectural Conservation, Ancient Cultural Routes and Industrial Heritage. As you all are aware, the Scientific sub-committees comprised professionals and outstanding personalities of the society in the relevant areas of heritage studies. The professional input of these heritage experts has been of much importance to the Trust activities. Some of the sub-committees helped to publish their works in the form of research materials and books supplement to the special publication series and some others conducted workshops and seminars of heritage importance to the members and the general public. Due appreciation has to be placed on record here to Dr. Roland Silva, Prof. Nimal de Silva and the members of the sub-committees including the relevant Anchor Persons for keeping the sub-committee interests going and to Dr. Nilan Coorey, the Assistant Secretary General for coordinating the Scientific Sub-committee meetings with much success.

- **Special Monthly Lectures conducted by selected scholars on Heritage Subjects and commencement of simultaneous transmission of the same to out stations:**

During the year 2012 also, the special lecture programme of the Trust became the most popular item of activity of Trust and it continued without any interruption. From the inception to date 48 Special Lectures have been conducted and out of this number, 11 were presented to

the membership and the interested public during the period under review. The following were the special lectures presented in 2012;

10. “Historic Gardens of the World with Special Reference to Sigiriya - **Archt. Dr. Nilan Cooray**

Today soon after this AGM we are going to listen to the 49th Special Lecture of the whole series, scheduled to be presented by our Trustee, Prof. Seneke Bandaranayake. The programme as a whole has been a great success with an attendance of more than 150 to 300 participants at each lecture by both the members and the interested general public including a fair number of members of our younger generation. In addition to the educational and academic value to the participants, the special monthly lectures brought in much publicity to the National Trust and its activities providing a big boost to the membership drive and its fundraising efforts. . The results have been immensely gratifying as shown by the response made by the relevant scholars and in delivering the special lectures in an honorary capacity. It is also planned to preserve and publish the lecture presentations in CD and print form for the use of other interested academics and make this facility available to heritage lovers in outstations.

Another milestone towards the success of this activity was to extend this facility to outstations. This was tried first in September 2012 by commencing a simultaneous transmission to Kandy with the assistance of Dialog and the Mayor of Kandy supported by the key members of the Trust living in Kandy it is functioning well at present. We wish to record our deep appreciation to the members of the Lecture Committee headed by Mr. U.L.Kadurugamuwa and Mr. N.G. Wickremarathne of the Management Committee and Prof. Arjuna Aluvihare of the Kandy Team continuing to assist the coordination of lectures including arranging the simultaneous transmission

and specially to the Board of Directors of the Hatton National Bank for providing the facilities of their Auditorium and the foyer to conduct the lectures and other activities. Our special thanks to Major General Lohan Gunawardena and the team of volunteers for their continued support to the Trust during the 2012 lecture session as well.

- **Quarterly Heritage Tours:**

As was in previous years this activity continued during 2012 with much success. Members, their families and friends were given an opportunity to visit a number of important cultural and natural sites and other places of common interest. All these tours were guided by eminent personalities with a view to disseminate knowledge among the participants. Four quarterly tours were conducted successfully. The last quarterly tour of 2012 to some selected heritage sites in the South, was recorded as a peak of success in terms of the head of the Tour Committee, the Late Ms. Nirmala de Mel who played an enthusiastic role getting the project going. Publication of Tour Guide Books also continued for the benefit of the participants. They are available now for the members and the general public. The services extended by some trustees and members voluntarily to guide the participants and the Tour Committee and M/s Quickshaws headed by our Trustee the Late Ms. Nirmala de Mel, Ms. Devika and Dr Nilan Coorey by assisting the Tour Committee to prepare the guide book etc. are deeply appreciated.

- **Publication of a series of ten special volumes on Cultural and Natural Heritage :**

Being one of the other main activities, publication of special volumes on heritage subjects also during the period under review. Out of a total of twelve volumes planned, six books had been published by the time of the last AGM (2011). The recommended authors of four other publications namely Animals of Sri Lanka, Trees of Sri Lanka, Ancient Jewelry of Sri Lanka and Waterfalls of Sri Lanka have completed their texts during the year 2012 and they are scheduled to be printed during 2013 once sponsors are found. Two sponsors have already agreed to fund two of the above. Efforts are being taken to find sponsors for other publications as well. On behalf of the Trust and its general members I take this opportunity to extend due gratitude to the authors, the designer and the copy editor for devoting their valuable time in writing and designing these handsome volumes and so making their contribution to the nation. The National Trust wishes to place on record the due appreciation of the sponsors who have agreed to meet the cost of printing, thus extending their generosity to promote the cultural traditions of our country. We also thank the trustees who took the initiative to find suitable sponsors towards this worthy project. The special publications project has become one of the sources of funding to the Trust as well.

- **Membership Drive, Fund Raising and Extension of Trust Activities :**

With a view to expand the activities of the Trust and to make the Trust popular among a wider public, the membership drive was launched, and a 300 membership target was achieved during the year with the regular appeals done monthly after every lecture sessions. The National Trust achieved the target of the membership drive even beyond what was expected, thanks to the untiring efforts taken by the Members of the Management Committee. As mentioned above it is 325 at present with an increase of more than 100 members.

A fair number of new members joined during the year and the number of life members increased from 71 in 2011 to 93 in 2012. There are plans underway to expand its activities geographically to other parts of the country. As an initial step there is a plan to make the special monthly lectures available in copy form to the heritage loving people living in out stations such as Kandy, Galle and Jaffna.

Requirement of funds for the day to day operations and to get the activities implemented by the National Trust increased during the year 2012 with the expansion of its scope. The total spending reached a sum of Rs.1.98 million and the Trust managed to raise funds over and above this requirement during 2012. (Details are given in the Audited Statement of Accounts) This was possible due to the efforts of the Management Committee which guided the Trust to have a more effective management and control system in its income and expenditure. The sources of funding have been local and international donors, sponsors, well wishers and the general membership fees. A sum of Rs. 1.3 m was received as a donation from the G.C. Mendis Foundation and the Trust deeply appreciate this gesture of the Directors of that Foundation. The Hatton National Bank continued to contribute its generous contribution to meet the expenditure of day to day affairs of the Trust during 2012 as well. The Directors of that bank should be complimented for this generous grant. When presenting the Statement of Accounts for the year 2012 you will enlighten more on this subject .

- **Assisting other institutions dealing with the subject of the preservation of heritage and the promotion of international cooperation on heritage activities.**

As it was practiced in the previous years, the National Trust continued to be associated with the extraordinary work of collaboration with public and private sector national and international institutions such as The Department of Archaeology, Department National Museums, Urban Development Authority, Colombo Municipality and the National Physical Planning Department on various heritage projects. The international institutions associated with were the Prince Claus Fund (PCF) of the Netherlands, the International National Trust Organization(INTO), the Dutch –Sri Lanka Association and the Centre for International Heritage Activities(CIE) in the Netherlands. The National Trust extended its assistance to heritage institutions in Sri Lanka by way of providing expert and specialist services and advise given by the senior professionals available with the Trust.

Two committees of National Trust experts have been appointed to give advisory support to complement the special projects such as the restoration of the Jaffna Medieval Grid City and Environmental Enhancement projects in and around Colombo. The conservation of the Malwana Ancient Fort which was commenced about two years ago continued into its Phase II in 2012. . In this context the National Trust took the initiative to raise funds from the Prince Claus Fund by assisting the Department of Archaeology in preserving one of the declared monuments owned by a private party. It is hoped to extend this facility to other monuments such as the Hanwella Fort and other Forts in the Kelani River Valley. The National Trust also participated in an important seminar on “ Public-Private Participation on the heritage of Sri Lanka “ organized jointly by the Dutch Embassy in Colombo, Ministries of National Heritage, Culture and Tourism Development and Centre for International Heritage Activities (CIE) of the Netherlands. With regard to INTO the NT-SL has already become a member with a view to having more international and region cooperation with other National Trusts.

Other Projects being implemented and being planned for the near future:

Other projects covering the preparation of the **WEBSITE of the Trust assisted by Ms. A. Kadurugamuwa, Mr. N.G. Wickremarathne** and Dr, Kavan Rathnatunge and publication of another series of books titled **“The Seven Arts of Sri Lanka- Outstanding International and National Artists of an Era, at the end of the 20th Century”** which was initiated during 2010 continued to continued to 2012 to achieve its end objective. This is in addition to the on- going 12 special publications project expected to be launched with a view to honour the outstanding Sri Lankan Artists and Writers who contributed immensely to the country in the fields of Sculpture, Painting, Architecture, Dance, Music, Literature and Drama.

Initiative was taken during the year to start several other projects namely , the **“Promotion of Modern Arts”**, publication of a separate **Volume covering all Heritage Tours** conducted by the Trust from the beginning, As recorded in my last report the National Trust hopes to continue these programmes and activities in the future along with the introduction of new activities under its projected plans for the year 2013 and onwards.

As was in the past, the achievements of the National Trust during the year 2012 have been mainly due to the team spirit and the strong commitment and the dedication of the Trustees, Key members of the Management Committee , the Members of the Scientific and other Sub-Committees and the general membership. The commitment and the enthusiasm exhibited by the team of volunteers who was with through-out has also been commendable.

Let us take this opportunity to salute all the Trustees and Volunteers for sparing their valuable time and in making valuable contributions to the Trust.

Hoping to see another successful year of operations, let me conclude my report for the year

2012.

President's Report for 2012

Dear Trustees, Dear Members, Dear Friends of the Trust,

This, indeed, is our family. It is this spirit that Senake and we dreamt that the Trust should be eight years ago. It is because Senake was temporarily overtaken by a simple ailment that we were requested to standby, and it is fortunate that Senake is listed to speak on the very day that we will be handing over the “Batten of the Trust” to Nimal while Senake still remains the guide and philosopher *ad infinitum*. And today being that ‘D day’ of the “Batten Change”, Senake is there to witness and bless the occasion.

Since the infant days we have moved some distance be it:

- **Monthly lectures on Culture and Nature,**
- **Transmitting the Monthly Lectures to Other Provincial Cities.**
- **Quarterly Tours to some Heritage Sites,**
- **Publishing on Select Living Elements or on the Creative Products of Humans,**
- **Promoting the Appreciation of the Private Collectors of Art,**
- **Recording Outstanding Creators of the Seven Arts of this Land in a yester-era,**
- **Sponsorship of the National Trust activities.**
- **Aliening the Sri Lankan National Trust with the International National Trusts.**

Monthly lectures on Culture and Nature

The National Trust is proud to note that with the Lecture to be delivered today by Prof. Senake Bandaranayake on “*Sri Lanka: Ancient and Early Maps,*” Will summarize to some extent, the type of message that we have attempted to impart to an average audience of 250 Regular Members of the Trust. This is the 49th Monthly Lecture to be delivered and every effort has been made to have these on the Web Page of the Trust. The International National Trust Organization [INTO] records a link to Sri Lanka’s Link.

Transmitting the Monthly Lectures to Other Provincial Cities

It was Prof. Arjuna Aluvihara at his lecture on Medical Instruments found at the 12th century Hospital at Polonnaruwa that suggested this idea of Members in two Provincial Capitals enjoying this unique facility. It is hoped to have this transmission available to the 23 UNESCO clubs established in that number of schools under the Heritage Committee of the Kandy Mayor and that held around 12 Noon on the last Friday of the month at the E.L.Senanayake Municipal Hall for the University Entrance students of these 23 clubs.

Quarterly Tours to some Heritage Sites

Since the inception of the Trust, Trustee Nirmala de Mel, Head of Quickshaws, has organized a Quarterly Tour on the last Saturday of the middle month of each quarter a day tour with a handsome lunch. The Post Graduate Institute of Archaeology that has provided free office space in the building has also made available parking within these premises for the forty or fifty participants to leave their cars for the whole day until they return in the night. These tours begin at 7 AM and return around 8 PM. A detailed academic booklet of 20 to 30 pages is prepared a new for each visit. With the passing away of Nirmala de Mel at the beginning of 2013 the author of these booklets has been requested to publish these 25 booklets into a single volume that can be conveniently kept in the cubby hole of a car for lovers of weekend tours. These day tours, like the lectures, are worthy sites of Nature or Culture, but imbibed in a palatable way.

Publishing on Select Living Elements or on the Creative Products of Humans

This series of books initially listed as the “Ten Prestigious Volumes” has well exceeded the titled numbers. The titles have now reached and may continue to increase. These are published jointly with the Central Cultural Fund as it is a programme that is most sympathetic to the objectives of the CCF as well towards which the Trust has taken the initiative. Working together with the CCF has two other advantages in that its Act provides an incentive to the Sponsors to invest their profits on cultural projects as such investments are allowed as an ‘Expense Item’ for accounting purposes and so the Sponsor enjoys a near 33% tax rebate on such a contribution. The other is that the more affluent firms treat such investments as outreach work which the shareholders of the organization and sister institutions appreciate.

Promoting the Appreciation of the Private Collectors of Art,

It was the Director of the Postgraduate Institute of Archaeology together with a team of art lovers that addressed the Management Committee and indicated to them the importance of the ‘Patrons of the Artists’ and that the National Trust needs to extend a hand of appreciation to these enlightened institutions or individuals. With this objective in mind a sub-committee was formed and they are now identifying these patrons and are

arranging for the Members of the Trust to visit these collections express the sympathies of the Trust with their good work. As a start the Sapumal Foundation was visited and the 30 or more Members enjoyed this visit very well as the head of the organization explained the critical details to their success.

Recording Outstanding Creators of the Seven Arts of this Land in a yester-era

The National Trust was fortunate to develop this idea and be able to identify the National Trust's list of the 'Outstanding Creators of the Seven Arts of this Land in a yester-era' at the end of 1999. **Sculpture** - Tissa Ranasinghe, **Painting** - George Keyt, **Architecture** - Geoffrey Bawa, **Dance** - Chitrasena, **Music** - Amaradeva, **Literature** - Martin Wickramasinghe and **Drama** - E.R. Sarathchandra. The first book in the series will be launched today, which is that of Tissa Ranasinghe and written by Neville Weeraratne.

Sponsorship of the National Trust Activities

Sri Lanka is, indeed, fortunate in that there is good will all around us only if one looks for it systematically. This was the case with the National which was begun modestly on the goodwill of the Postgraduate Institute of Archaeology where the office still stands. It was there that the first lectures were held until the numbers grew over 100. Then we needed to rent space at ICCTAG until we were welcome by the Tourist Board Auditorium. Despite all these generosities the pressure and demand of the Members compelled us to move into the 22nd Floor of the HNB Towers that has 300 seats for the Members. It was at this juncture that Mr.N.G. Wickremeratne was able to persuade the Hatton National Bank Sustainability Foundation to be the Principal Sponsors of the National Trust Activities. The Trust and all its Members are deeply obliged to this organization. The Secretary General has recorded the other sponsors of specific projects.

Aliening the Sri Lankan National Trust with the International National Trusts

The International National Trust was established in 2009 at Delhi with fifty eight individual National Trusts joining hands to form a World Body. The oldest of these was the England, Wales and Northern Ireland National Trust that was founded as far back as 1894. The new body meets every two years and in 2013 they will meet in Africa. The main link with this organization is through Internet and the Sri Lankan Web Page is linked to this.

Other Information

The Secretary's Report provides the details of the many activities of the organization. As Prof. Nimal de Silva will be taking over as the President of the National Trust-Sri Lanka, I take this opportunity to thank the Trustees and Members of the Trust for their total cooperation and in helping the Council to develop this organization as near as could be to the dreamed objectives of Senake.
